Thank you for purchasing my CU Stitching Styles, I hope you will find them useful and enjoy working with them.

Here are some hints to help you achieve the stitching look for your papers:

- open paper **.jpg** file that you want to turn into a stitched patterned paper
- add a fill layer on top of it and apply one of the stitching styles to this layer
- double click on the style in the layer to open the style dialogue window and go to the pattern tab
- click in the main window (with the style window open) and click on the stitching. By holding down your mouse button you will be able to move the pattern around to match it to the paper pattern, use the scale slider in the style window to adjust the size of the stitches to match your paper pattern (you might want to lower the opacity of the style pattern to better see the paper below, but don't forget to put it back up)
- close the style window
- check the pattern fit in all 4 corners of your paper to make sure it fits, repeat the above process until you're happy with the result
- rasterize layer style and move this layer below the patterned paper
- turn the patterned paper into a clipping mask and change the blend mode to achieve the look you like
